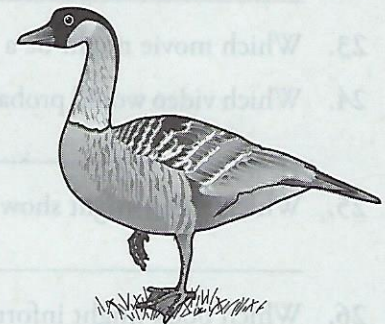

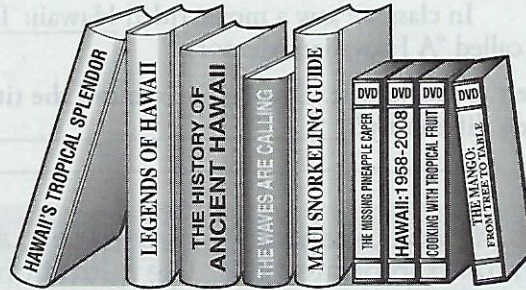


The nene, or Hawaiian goose, is Hawaii's state bird.
